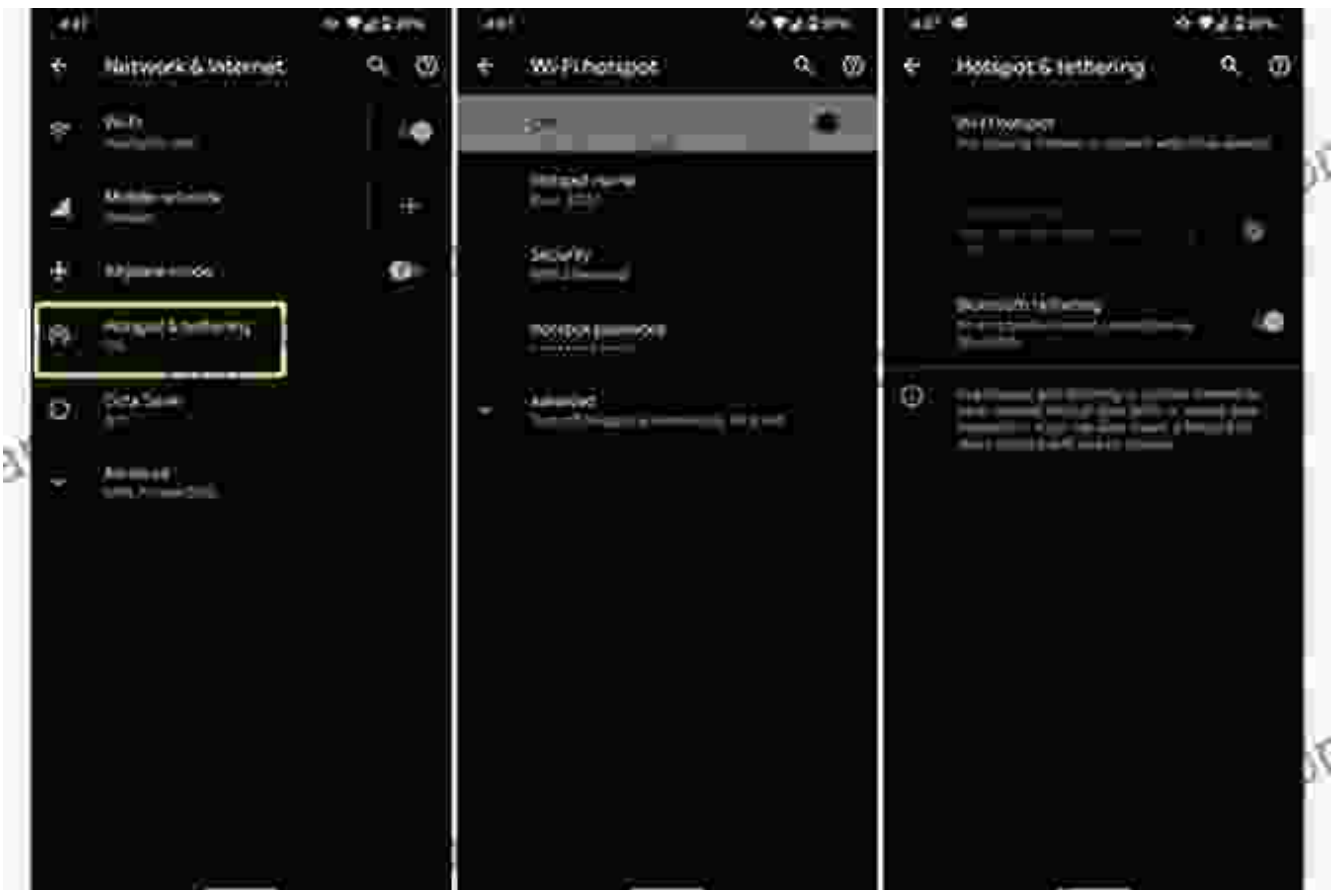


Bluetooth connection

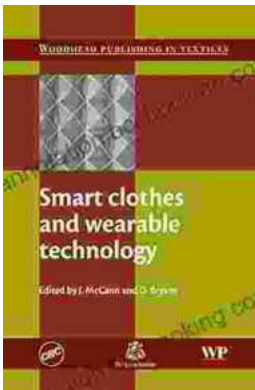

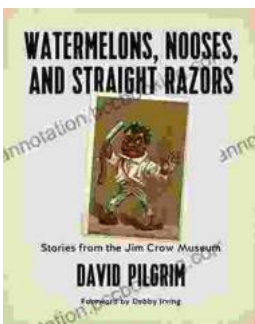
