* **Plan your trip during the dry season (December-April).** The rainy season (May-November) can make hiking and other outdoor activities more difficult. * **Bring plenty of bug spray and sunscreen.** The rainforest is home to a variety of insects and other creatures, so it's important to protect yourself from bites and stings. * **Wear comfortable shoes.** You'll be ng a lot of hiking, so it's important to wear shoes that are comfortable and supportive. * **Pack light.** You'll be ng a lot of walking, so it's important to pack light so you don't have to carry a heavy backpack. * **Be prepared for rain.** Even during the dry season, it's possible to experience rain in the rainforest. Be sure to pack a raincoat or poncho. * **Bring plenty of water.** The rainforest can be hot and humid, so it's important to stay hydrated. *

****Respect the wildlife.**** The rainforest is home to a variety of animals, so it's important to respect their space and avoid disturbing them.
