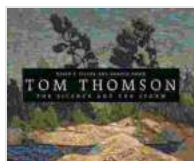

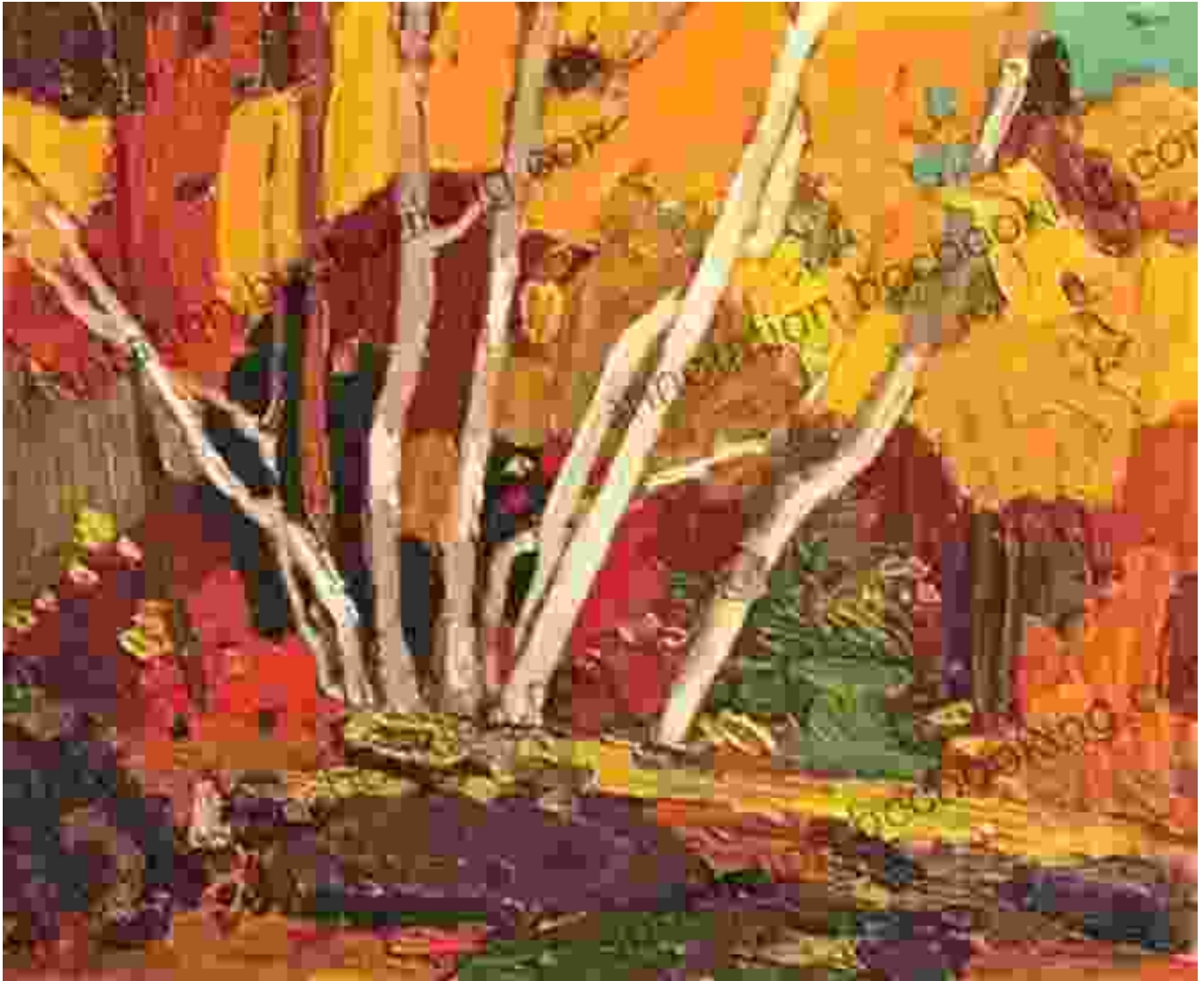
Early Life and Career

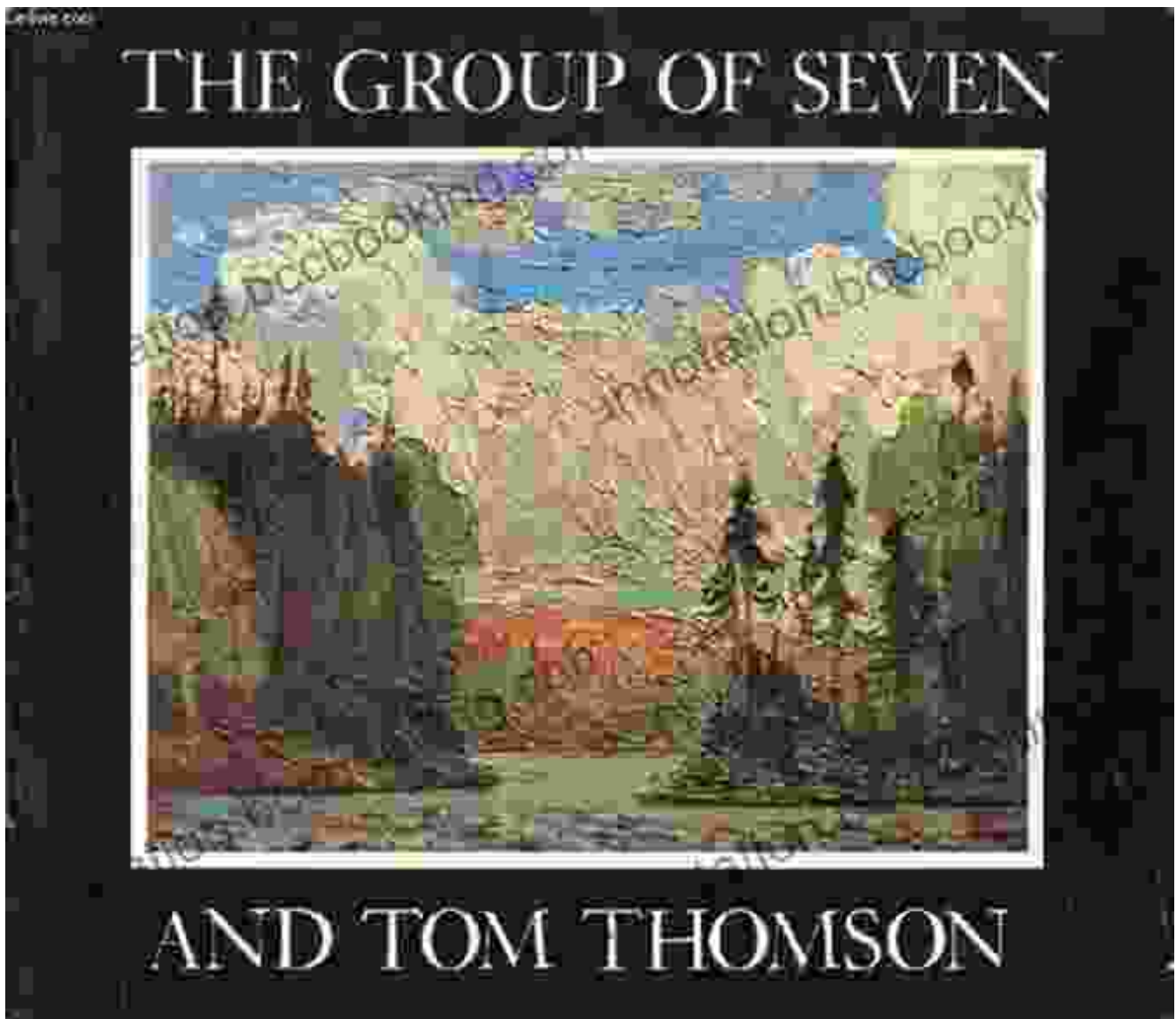

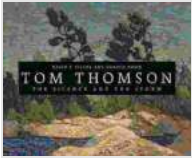

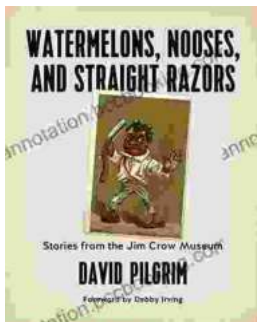
